President's Message



ith one year to go to the start of the 15th edition of the IAAF World Championships in London, 4 to 13 August 2017, it gives me great pleasure to write this foreword.

The first Official Bulletin of the IAAF World Championships London 2017 marks the beginning of the finishing straight for the event's planning and organisation.

2000 athletes from more than 200 nations will gather next summer in the 2012 Olympic stadium in Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park for what will be the biggest global championships of any sport in 2017.

The eyes of the sporting world will be on the British capital next August. Broadcast across the world to over 200 territories, ten days of full-on competition will reach an accumulated global audience of 6 billion.


700,000 tickets for the 14 competition sessions went on sale at the start of August. An innovative timetable and accessible prices offers everyone a great opportunity to witness the world's best athletes live in action at the largest sporting event to be held in the UK since the 2012 Olympic Games.

Another significant moment in the final countdown, the recruitment of up to 4000 volunteers, has also recently begun. The 'Runners', as the London volunteers are dubbed, will be a key part of organisation and the spectator experience. The 'Games Makers' at London 2012 were exceptional and the Runners next summer will be equally important in building the spirit of the championships.

Before the championships get underway London's ExCeL will stage the IAAF Congress (2 / 3 Aug) which will welcome 800 international delegates from more than 200 national member federations.

The enormity of the organisational task and the hard work should not be underestimated. Yet together the IAAF and the Local Organising Committee, with the support of our Official IAAF Partners and suppliers and national partners and suppliers, confidently look forward to delivering a spectacular IAAF World Championships London 2017.

Managing Director's Message

t is a huge honour for us to be hosting the IAAF World Championships London 2017 next summer and we are doing all we can to make sure that we put on the best event possible for athletes and spectators alike.



We will welcome thousands of athletes from

more than 200 countries who will compete in 14 sessions over 10 jam-packed and action fuelled days. Staging a World Athletics Championship is a big and complex undertaking but we are pleased to report that the project is on track and on budget.

All the building blocks are in place and we have met every project milestone. Our venues and accommodation for athletes are all approved. And just last week 700,000 tickets went on sale. With prices starting at just £20 and over one third of tickets priced at under £35, we know the Olympic Stadium will once again be full of crowds cheering on hundreds of world-class athletes.

But we are not complacent. We know there is still much to do and that there will inevitably be many challenges ahead for an event of this scale. We recognise that the hard work starts here but know that with the support of the IAAF and Official IAAF Partners and Suppliers we are in good shape to meet them.

We are confident the British public will embrace these World Championships in a way only they can – by welcoming the world to London next year for a fantastic summer of world athletics.





Setting the Scene: Newham Welcomes Athletics

uring the summer of 2012 the borough of Newham, a few miles from the City in the heart of London's East End, played host to the greatest show on earth – the Olympic and Paralympic Games. The spectacular sporting achievements of all the competitors helped create a truly unforgettable experience. And Britain's athletes made the host nation proud as they embodied hard work, courage and conviction in achieving their greatest ever gold medal haul in the Games.

But it was the warmth and excitement of Newham's residents as they welcomed millions of visitors from across the world that demonstrated the true spirit of the Games in an atmosphere unlike any other. Local volunteers helped entertain and direct visitors to the borough, and thousands of residents were supported to get Games Time jobs. Newham was at the heart of building and delivering the Games.

The Olympic and Paralympic Games have the power to inspire people and now, four years on, Newham is truly benefiting from the legacy that has been left behind. The Games provided the ideal catalyst to accelerate the transformation taking place in the borough. With its abundance of exciting developments, excellent transport links and a young and diverse population, the borough has truly become one of the most exciting places to visit in the UK.

It was vital that the energy of the Olympics and Paralympics was used to realise benefits for all Newham residents. As a borough, we have worked hard to ensure local people are able to access and enjoy the facilities that were built for the Games. This started with our 35% stake in the stadium. In partnership with the London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC), we are managing and overseeing the Olympic Stadium and the site for the next 102 years.



From 2016, the Stadium became the new home of West Ham United FC and the National Competition Centre for athletics in the UK, as well as a major venue for other sporting events. It is open all year round for visitor tours, arts and cultural events, conferences and music concerts. Now that West Ham have moved in, Newham's residents will also benefit from match and event tickets, as well as community days in the Stadium.

The 2012 Games was a vital part of the regeneration of the area which has seen millions of pounds being invested into new developments to further enhance the borough's status as a great place to live, work and visit. The scale of transformation is creating thousands of employment opportunities which Newham residents are benefitting from with the help of Workplace, the council's job brokerage service.

Our long-term aim is to achieve convergence in the borough which means that within 20 years the communities which hosted the 2012 Games will have the same social and economic chances as their neighbours across London. We are continuing to work tirelessly to make sure that the promise made in the London 2012 bid to inspire a generation does not fade. This is why we are also investing in Newham's Every Child a Sportsperson scheme where we give our school children the chance to try different sports and join clubs to develop their talents as we seek to create the next generation of Olympians and Paralympians.

We are determined to transform the lives of those living in London's East End, especially the residents of Newham.



Setting the Scene: The Stadium

he Stadium which witnessed sporting history during the London 2012 Games will break further new ground next year as it becomes the first venue to host both the IAAF World Championships and the World ParaAthletics Championships.

The events of four years ago proved that the Stadium can deliver crowds, atmosphere and excitement, and 2017 promises to match all of that during the Summer of World Athletics.

Since the 2012 Games a lot has moved on in Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. The iconic Stadium has undergone a major programme to transform it into a multi-use venue fit for the future. The Stadium is now the National Competition Centre for UK Athletics and the home of West Ham United football team. A new retractable seating system has been installed on all four sides of the ground to allow fans to get closer to the action, a new roof covers every seat and delivers the atmosphere and energy expected of a world-class arena, and a brand new track will ensure athletes have the best surface to deliver world records.

In the past four years the Stadium has started to establish itself as a truly world class venue hosting spectacular events such as the Anniversary Games, which returned to the Stadium this year with the likes of world and Olympic champions Mo Farah, Jessica Ennis-



Hill and six-times IPC World Champion David Weir in attendance. It was also delighted to welcome back the world's fastest man Usain Bolt, and to witness a world 100m hurdles record of 12.20sec from Kendra Harrison of the United States. The Stadium was proud to host five Rugby World Cup 2015 matches and the amazing Race of Champions which saw motor racing legends compete on a specially built track inside the Stadium.

This August West Ham United will host their first Premier League game at the Stadium, with a likely appearance for Dimitri Payet, who lit up the recent Euro 2016 tournament with his performances for the French hosts. In November Rugby League returns, with England taking on Australia. Outside of sport Rock legends AC/DC played to a full house and tested the new roof and acoustics in the Stadium's inaugural concert.

However, the Stadium story is not just about elite sport and the transformation has also delivered a state-of-the-art community facility – the London Marathon Community Track. Located in the shadow of the Stadium, this facility will be the warm-up track for the IAAF World Championships and the World ParaAthletics Championships in 2017 and then it will be available for schools and community use to ensure the next generation has the best possible opportunity to reach the top.

Setting the Scene: UK Sport Gold Series

K Sport is the nation's high performance sports agency responsible for the strategic investment of National Lottery and Exchequer funding in Olympic and Paralympic sports preparing for Rio 2016 and beyond.

UK Sport's Major Events Programme will invest over £50million of National Lottery funding through to 2023 to support the bidding and staging costs of major events on home soil, as well as providing specialist support to organisers. Events are supported for their likely performance impact on GB athletes, but also to maximise

wider sporting, social, cultural, economic and environmental benefits.

UK Sport is aiming to bring over 100 of the world's most prestigious sporting events to the UK, including the IAAF World Championships London 2017 and World ParaAthletics Championships. This ambitious programme will support British athletes' preparation and qualification future Olympic and Paralympic Games, while generating approximately £500 million in Economic Impact to the host cities and regions, and offering an estimated eight million spectators the opportunity to experience world class sport on home soil.



Setting the Scene: Member Federation Ticketing

A Q&A WITH GEORGIA BEKYRA, HEAD OF TICKETING OPERATIONS FOR IAAF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS LONDON 2017

When is next year's IAAF World Championships?

The IAAF World Championships take place at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, London between August 4-13 2017.

What does your day-to-day role entail?

From day one in the role I have had to factor in a number of stakeholders into the planning process. Across the 14 sessions of the IAAF World Championships there will be 700,000 tickets on sale and a lot of work has gone into finalising that figure. I have had to create stadium plans which will accommodate a number of key personnel including broadcasters, camera positions, TV studios, press seating, hospitality seating and coaches' positions which all have to be blocked out prior to going on sale.

I also have to liaise closely with Ticketmaster (ticketing and software provider) as well as member federations and the IAAF to ensure the ticketing process is managed seamlessly.

What is the pricing strategy for IAAF World Championships London 2017?

One of the main aims of IAAF World Championships London 2017 is to encourage families to come and watch the world's best athletes in one of the most iconic stadiums, but without paying over the odds to attend. One of the price points was children's tickets for £9.58 in honour of Usain Bolt's 100m world record, which

brings a fun element but also a sense of affordability to the British public and those attending from overseas. Tickets across the sessions represent value for money, with prices starting from £20 for morning sessions and £35-£45 for evening sessions. For this fans will have the opportunity to watch the world's biggest stars for up to four hours in the first outdoor global championships after the Olympic Games in Rio.

When will tickets become available?

We've had a very successful pre-sale period in May-June this year and we went to public ballot on 1 August 2016. Any tickets left over will be available for sale on a first come, first served basis later on in 2016.

The UK has staged a number of ground-breaking events over the last few years including the Olympic and Paralympic Games, Rugby Union World Cup, Rugby League World Cup and Commonwealth Games just to name a few. We want people from all over the world to come back and sample the electric atmosphere that we've experienced so many times in the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.
